





## Tabletops natural elegance

In an age when sweet nothings are shouted into cell phones and words of adoration arrive via text message, it is hardly a surprise that couples crave a sense of sanctuary on their wedding day. Tabletop designs set a mood that is reminiscent of an era when families dined together, where eyes convey more meaning than words and love can seemingly halt the passage of time.


could happen in your own backyard."

Floral arrangements can be extravagant, like a table by California designer Jeff Johnson of Square Root that mixes 350 purple, lavender, and fuchsia orchids to create a virtual canopy of flowers. Others, however, have turned to "a more naturalistic style of design," says Cohen: "People are choosing flowers that you would find in a garden." In addition to tall and low flower arrangements, Cohen is experimenting with medium-height designs that add variety without impeding conversation.

Eric Buterbaugh of Eric Buterbaugh Flower Design in Los Angeles strives for the right juxtaposition of "contemporary floral design with more classic accourrements." Clients want "very luxurious flowers presented in a modern way," he says.
